







Panic! At The Disco mantra heard throughout our interview is that they "love working with interesting people". The same curiosity that has drawn them to share venues with loops like Foxy Shazam is showcased in the filmclip for "The Ballad of Mona Lisa", taking place at a steampunk themed funeral for a recently murdered chap (one of the three characters played by Urie).



"We love costumes," he confirms. "We worked with a team called The League of Steam and they are awesome. They build all their own gadgets. They have all their own clothes that they make themselves. We wanna make the songs as dramatic as we can make them."

Whether the style of the clip will spill on the stage is uncertain as the band is still somewhat haunted by the nerves and pageantry of their early tours.


